

F.O.R.R. has seen the successful passage of a bill in the Missouri House of Representatives making the wearing of helmets by anyone over 21 years old an act of choice. Their (and our) work isn't done yet, though. The Senate version was derailed at the end of the session when attention was drawn from this issue to that of gay marriage, among others. Through the efforts of F.O.R.R., this bill came close to passage this year. Maybe with your support they will get it done next year. If F.O.R.R. calls for your support in this endeavor, please stand up and give it to them. On the other side of the river, A.B.A.T.E. staged a successful call-in program to keep Illinois legislators from adding a rider to a bill making it mandatory to wear a helmet while operating an ATV. It seems like that might be an insidious way to backdoor the whole helmet issue.



folks who came to "The Hottest Little Party in the Midwest". There was live music provided every night until 3:30. Among the bands that played over the course of the 3 nights were: Cottonmouth, Minx, Ross and Rotten, Plain Strange, 5 O'clock Shadow, 64 East, the Last Call Band and more. Nearby there is also Cave In Rock, the Garden of the Gods (which has some really excellent rock formations), Crab Orchard Lake is another nice place and there is also the large cross at Alto Pass that is the site of one of the biggest bike blessings every year.


And another thing, while I'm at it... Don't take every possible inconvenience as a personal attack on you. Things happen. Problems arise. People goof up. I

Surdyke Supports the Troops by Jim Furey

The **Surdyke family of motorcycle dealerships** stood up in a big way on the weekend of May 22 and 23 to show their support for the USO and the United States Armed Forces. On Saturday they had bike shows at all their dealerships, along with radio personalities and other contests. Sunday's events started off with the Gypsy Rendezvous group ride and culminated with the presentation of a check to the USO, the raffling off of a 2004 Fatboy, and the announcement of the overall winner of the bike show.

Gary Surdyke, the owner of the dealerships and a veteran himself, first approached the USO with the idea last year. That event was a huge success, but this year's event was even more successful. The James S. McDonnell USO, located at Lambert Field in St. Louis, provides services free of charge to more than 114,000 service members and their families every year. I am proud to say that my sister and the magazine's editor, Jennifer Furey, has volunteered her time at the USO for the past 3 years.

We went over to the *Gateway to the West* dealership on Saturday afternoon. The weather was great, and a bunch of friendly folks were out enjoying the day, visiting with KSHE 95 radio personality Katy Kruze, checking out the really sharp bikes, and saying "Hello" to friends old and new. Among the new friends we met were Ivy Trosclair Jr. and his son, Ivy Trosclair III, the creative geniuses behind Metry Custom Cycles. These talented builders have a connection to St. Louis, that being that not only did they build Rams tackle Kyle Turley's bike but he is also a partner in their company. Kyle showed up after minicamp to visit and took time with all who approached

him. The Trosclairs will be appearing on the Discovery Channel soon (watch for a more detailed article about them and their fine machines in an upcoming issue). We also had a chance to speak once again with Paul Yaffe, whose super-sharp bikes have already graced these pages.



The hosts of this event—the staff members of the dealership—were kept very busy, but with the help of some of St. Louis County's finest, the event had no issues at all. Sunday dawned with the weather looking a little ominous; undaunted, the riders from the three dealerships made some small concessions to the weather and rode on. I rode with the group that started at **Gateway to the West Harley-Davidson**, while the others departed **Surdyke Harley-Davidson in Festus, Missouri**, and **Dale's Harley-Davidson in Mt. Vernon, Illinois**. It seemed like the line of motorcycles went on forever as the 343 bikes that set off from *Gateway* left the parking lot. Channel 2 was there, filming them all as they left. The ride down to Fort Kaskaskia was fun. This is really a beautiful spot overlooking the Kaskaskia River, and I suggest you check it out. Lunch was available, and off in the distance you could see the lightning flash as the weather continued to threaten. It rained a little while we were there, but not enough to dampen the riders' spirits. Paul Yaffe was on the ride with our group and he traded stories with the other riders and was very friendly and approachable.

The riders, more than 600 in all, from the three dealerships then stopped at the National Veteran's Cemetery at Jefferson Barracks. If you have never been there, it is a very moving place, with row upon row of grave markers for those who have served our country. The riders paused for a brief check presentation of \$2,000 and military volleys from the Missouri Military Funeral Honors Team before receiving a police escort

back to the *Gateway to the West* dealership. There, music was provided by the Good Time Oldies and the Little Berry Jam bands. Food was served free of charge by Hooter's Restaurants and free beer was provided by the good folks at Grey Eagle Anheuser-Busch Distributing. The winners from the bike shows at the various dealers were gathered at *Gateway to the West* to determine who had the best bike. This was done by popular ballot, with ballots being sold to raise more money for the USO. As the event was drawing to a close, the winner of the Best of Show for the three dealerships was announced. The winner was Skip Nace; this proud owner of the winning 1949 Pan Head is also a member of the Festus HOG Chapter.

Tickets were also sold for a chance to win a 2004 Harley-Davidson Fatboy that was to be raffled off that day as well. The excitement built as the time grew closer to draw for this sharp piece of Milwaukee steel. The winner of the bike, Dawn Cissell, was thrilled as her name was called and she rushed up to the stage to claim her prize, which was generously donated by the dealerships. At this time the Gateway to the West HOG Chapter presented their donation of \$400 to the USO.

The highlight of the day, and what was the driving force behind this, the largest dealer-sponsored event in the Midwest, was the presentation of the check for the \$13,000 raised during this event to USO Development Director Janice Raeber and the two Army service

members who guide new recruits at the airport—SGT Pike and SPC Bernier. To see the joy that this presentation gave them brought to life the words of dealership owner Gary Surdyke: "This event stands for everything that makes our country great. It's about freedom; it's about supporting our troops, raising money for the USO, and having a good time in the process."

Well folks, it's that time again, so let's get right to it. When I blasted off this time I wasn't sure which way I wanted to go, but since I was doing this on a weekday and it was just me and my girl, we decided to just pick a direction and see where it took us. So we headed east on Highway 177 in Illinois. As we rode through Mascoutah we stopped in for a short visit with Jamie and Jeff at the Juicy Peanut to see what was up. They have really been working hard on that place. It looks great; make sure you check it out. After saying our goodbyes we continued east to see what was beyond Mascoutah. The first place we came to was the Driftwood Inn, just outside Okawville, Illinois. No sooner had we walked in then we were greeted with a smile from the bartender, Angela, who was as helpful as she was pretty. I told her who I was and she took me to meet her leader, Bob Nocito. Turns out Bob was there that day working on the addition that will be a full-service kitchen by mid-summer. The Driftwood Inn also features live music every weekend. We said goodbye to Angela and Bob and headed off down the road.



Our next stop was Addieville because I had heard about a place that has great food there. We left Okawville on Route 160 and followed it to Addieville. This is a town that can't get much farther *Off the Beaten Path*, but it is not hard to find. Our destination here was a place called the Eagles Nest, and it is the only bar in town. It is situated right next to the grain elevator. One of the interesting things about this place is that owner Todd Boeschem cuts his own meat for the restaurant, and the place smells great—you will definitely get hungry just walking in the door. After sampling some of Tom's hospitality it was time to see what else the road held for us. We headed out on Route 15 through Nashville to Route 127. There we turned north toward New Minden and a very old place called the Blue Room. Now, for as

long as this place has been there I would bet that just about all of us have been there at one time or another. It has been a bar for more than 100 years and is now owned by Rick and Julie Matherlee who are members of A.B.A.T.E. themselves. They also own three other bar-and-grill type places out this way. If you do make it to the Blue Room, make sure you get a chance to strike up a conversation with an old guy named Reinholdt Sprehe. This man is a living history lesson as well as a super nice guy.

After our visit there it was once again time to hit the road, so we continued on to Carlyle and the Flamingo, which is owned by the same fine folks who own the Blue Room. This historical building is the very first bar you see on the right as you roll into town, and it is much more modern than the Blue Room. Delsa the bartender is definitely worth mentioning, everyone there was very nice to us, and the food was great. You've got to make sure you stop here on your next ride out this way.

For the best scenery on our ride back we decided to take old Route 50 (which is Monroe St.), which is half a block south of the Flamingo. A right turn takes us to Breese, where we stopped in at a place called Jimmy T's. At first glance this place looks like a yuppie bar, but don't let that fool you. The people are great and they have a full-service kitchen with all the fish you can eat on Fridays and all-you-can-eat chicken on Sundays. I met a dude there named Daryl Voss who should be on the comedy tour somewhere. If you get the chance, stop in and check this place out. Finally we pulled ourselves away from Daryl's barstool comedy act. It was getting dark so we cruised into Lebanon for a quick stop at Brewers, which everybody knows is famous around these parts for its beautiful bartenders. I also don't think there is anything cooler than the historic look of downtown Lebanon with its brick streets, especially at night. If you've never been there we invite you to come see what this town has to offer. From there it was back to our starting point in Belleville, only a hop, skip, and a jump away. This was another great ride, so until next time stay cool and *Live to Ride*.
